Community - The Chatham Central School District, composed of the Village of Chatham and several other rural communities, is located in Columbia County. The district is within a 30-mile commuting distance to Albany, New York. The village is a well-established community, residential in nature. One elementary school, one middle school, and one high school serve the approximately 1050 students enrolled in Pre-kindergarten through grade 12.

School - Chatham High School is a public, comprehensive high school with an enrollment of approximately 350 students in grades 9-12. The student/faculty ratio is 13 to 1. Over 90% of our professional staff have a Master's Degree or higher.

Accreditation – The New York State Department of Education and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Commencement Expectations - The graduate from the Chatham Central School District is an effective communicator, a critical and creative thinker, a user of technology, a self-directed individual, a collaborative worker, and a contributing citizen.

Regents Courses -English, Global History, US History and Government, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, French, and Spanish.

Advanced Placement Courses – English Literature, Biology, American History, European History, World History, and Calculus AB. (Pre-AP courses in English and Social Studies)

Dual-Enrollment - The following courses are available for students to earn college credit through the State University of New York: Advanced Placement US History and Government, French 4 and 5, Spanish 4 and 5, Accounting, Marketing, Management, Psychology, Sociology, Public Speaking, Mythology and 21st Century Computer applications. New Visions Program through Questar III: Students may earn college credit while completing a concentration in a career focused program at an area college or hospital.

Accelerated Programs in Mathematics, Science and Foreign Language begin for eligible students in Grade 8.

Grading System - A 100-point numerical grading system is in effect. Course grades are the straight numerical average of all quarter grades and final/Regents exams. Minimum passing grade is 65. A cumulative weighted Grade Point Average (Academic GPA on transcript) is computed for each student. This average is used in determining class rank.

Regents, Applied Courses, Remedial and AIS final course grades are multiplied by 1.00 to obtain a weighted grade.

Accelerated and Pre-AP final course grades are multiplied by 1.03 to obtain a weighted grade.

All Advanced Placement final course grades are multiplied by 1.06 to obtain a weighted grade.

The weighted Grade Point Average is computed as follows: each weighted grade is multiplied by its credit value; the grades are then totaled, and divided by the number of credits attempted.

Students' rankings are reported in 5% intervals.
